LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Upon completion, participants will be able to:

- Demonstrate in-depth understanding of disease process and risk factors.
- Discuss prevention strategies and how to counsel smoking cessation.
- Discuss elements of comprehensive history and physical exam and demonstrate understanding of the significance of information gathered.

- Apply criteria for diagnosis and staging to case study patients.

- Discuss key elements of end-of-life care.

TARGET AUDIENCE

Nurses, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, respiratory therapists, physical therapists, pharmacists, case managers, physicians, and other health professionals actively involved in the care of patients with COPD.
